● Leaf Matching

Set out crayons, colored pencils, and markers for this activity. Encourage kids to color in the rest of the leaves after they find the two that match. Suggest they save the page to use as part of a leaf scavenger hunt outdoors. Can they find real leaves to match those on the page?

★ Autumn Scene Coloring Page

Colored pencils and markers may work best for kids to color in some of the finer details on the artwork in this activity. Have kids make up a story about the people and objects in the scene. Guide them in their storytelling by asking questions such as "What is happening in the picture?" "What does the girl plan to do with the pumpkin?" "Who is the boy picking the apples for?"

■ Decorate a Turkey

Be sure to set out tape or glue for kids to use to adhere the feathers to the body of the turkey. Encourage kids to name their turkey, describe its personality, and perhaps partner with another child or two to put on an impromptu puppet show!

◆ Daylight Saving Time

You may want to explain to children how Daylight Saving Time is the practice of changing clocks to move one hour ahead during spring and summer months so that daylight lasts longer. In the fall, Daylight Saving Time ends and clocks are adjusted backward one hour to standard time.

▲ Be Thankful Cards

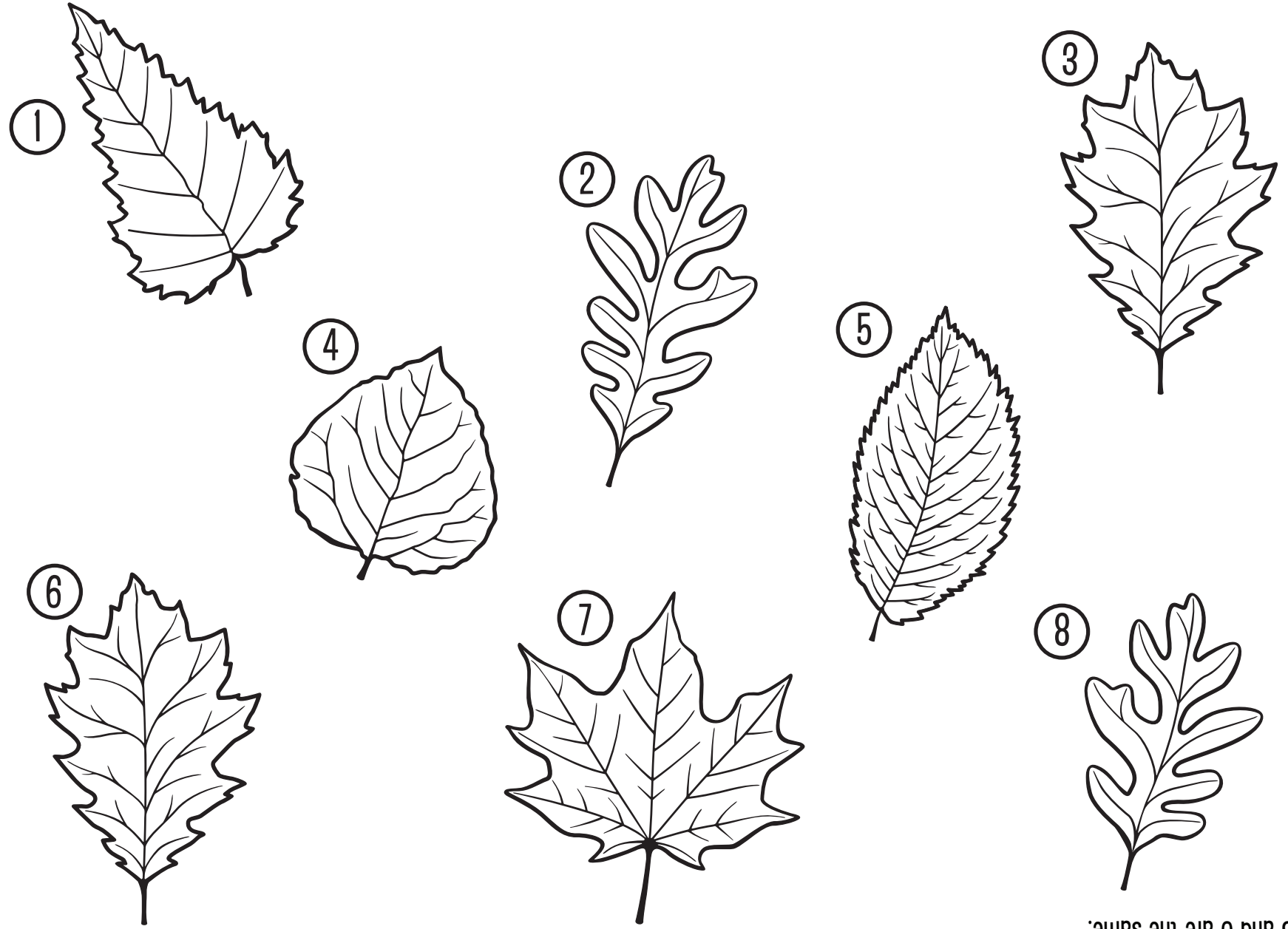
For younger kids who may not be able to write or spell, help them come up with the words and encourage them to draw a picture of what they are thankful and grateful for. Older children may want to challenge themselves to write a sentence about one thing they are thankful for using the letters for each word in the sentence. Suggest children cut out the cards and place them on the refrigerator or at the Thanksgiving dinner table!

DIRECTIONS: Can you find the 2 leaves that are the same? Color them YELLOW.



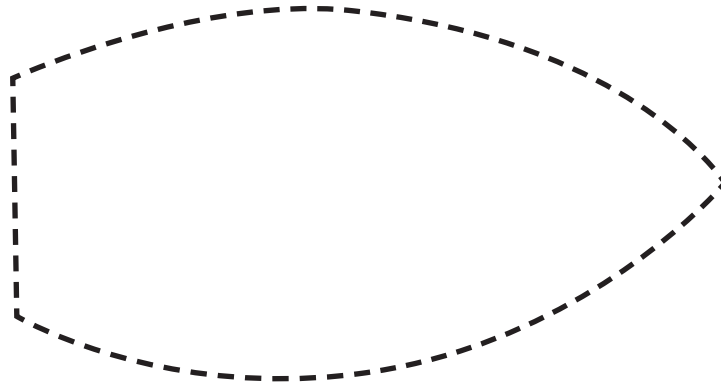
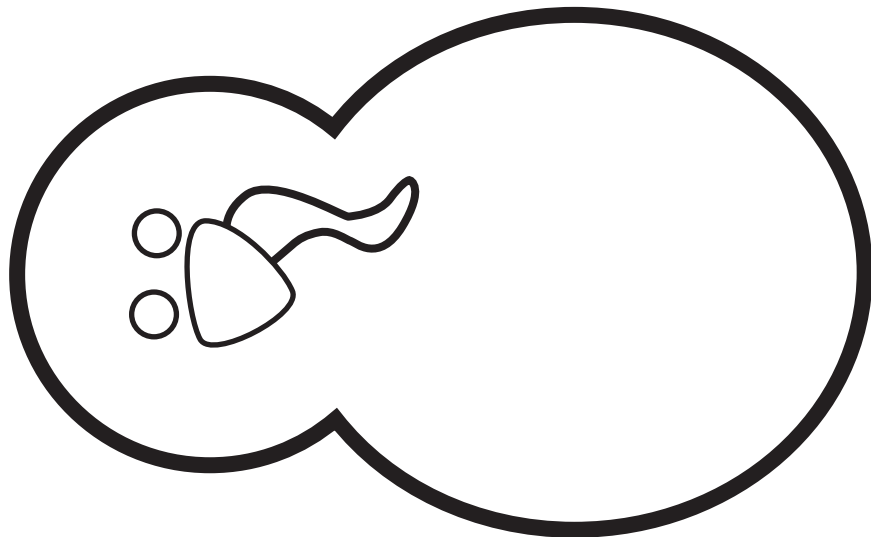
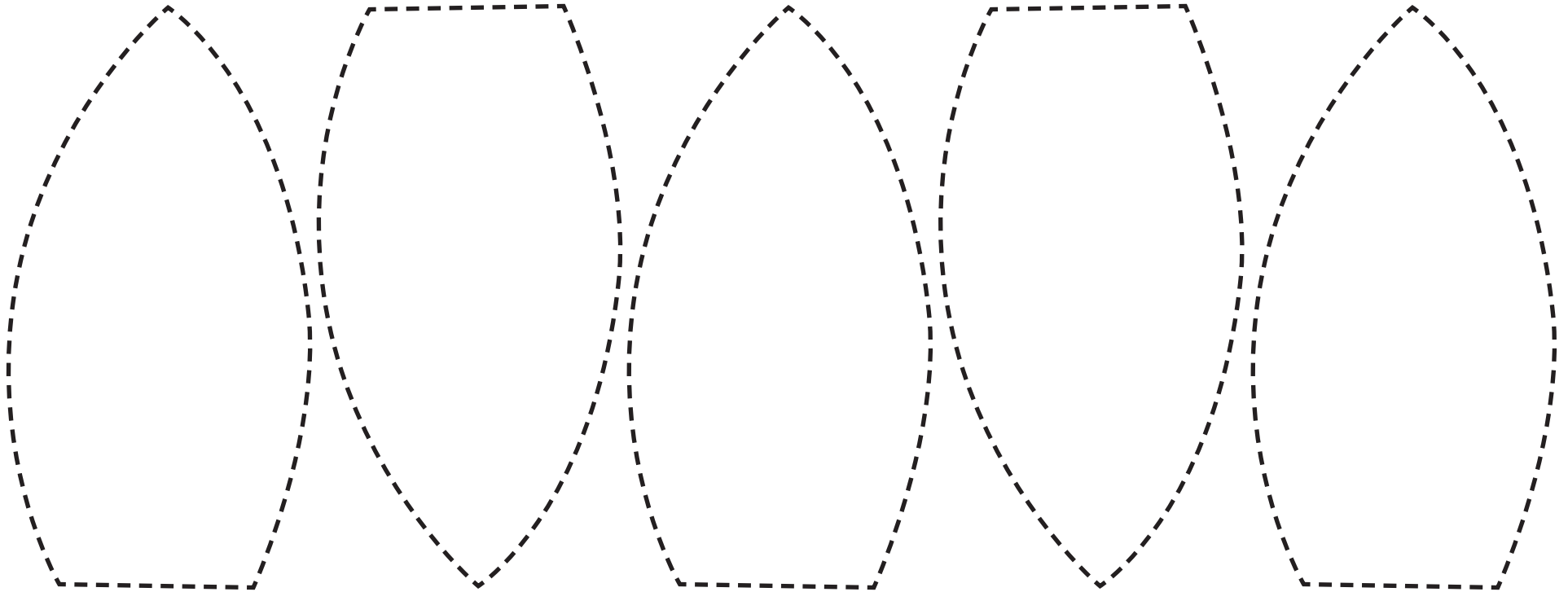
Answer: 3 and 6 are the same.

DIRECTIONS: Color in this festive fall scene. Then tell a story about the picture!

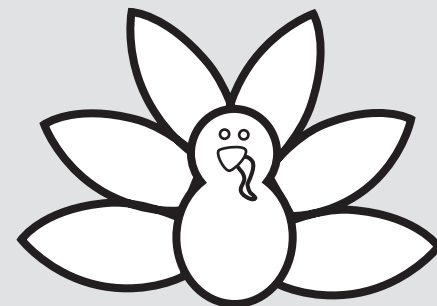


Decorate a Turkey

DIRECTIONS: Decorate the turkey body and feathers. Cut them out to make your own mini turkey!



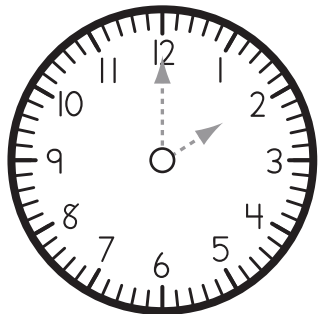
How to Make the Turkey



DIRECTIONS: When Daylight Saving Time ends in the fall, we set our clocks back one hour.

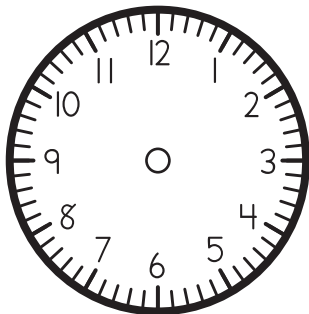
What time does this clock say?

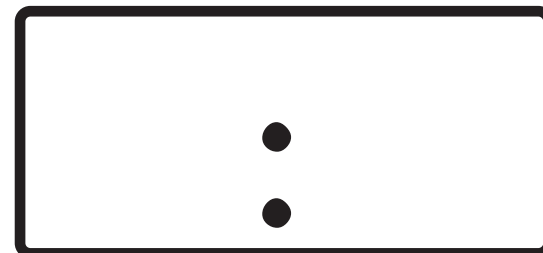
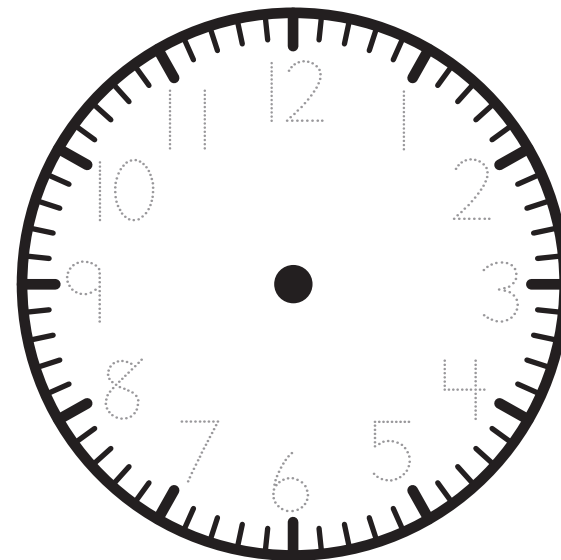
“Fall back” one hour and draw the new time on the clock below.

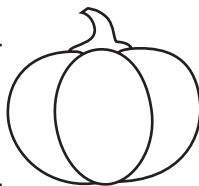




Be Thankful Cards
